# VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR



The Village Board approved a contract with Kyle Ellefson as the new Village Administrator on Monday, July 18th at a Special Village Board meeting. Kyle is expected to start on Monday, August 22.

Kyle is familiar with the Village of Johnson Creek as he previously lived in the Village. He served as paid on call Emergency Medical Technician from June 2013 to April 2014 when he was elected as a Village Trustee. He served on the Village Board until he moved in May of 2015 when he accepted the City Administrator position for the City of Kewaunee.

Kyle received his Master of Arts in Public Administration with an emphasis on Public Finance & Budgeting, Municipal Management, Public Policy Analysis, Human Resource Management, Intergovernmental Management, and Program Evaluation from the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh. He received his

bachelor's degree from Concordia University of Wisconsin in Criminal Justice Management.

Kyle not only served as Village Trustee for the Village of Johnson Creek but also as a Board member for the City of Chilton and a Village Trustee for the Village of Pardeeville. He worked for the State of Wisconsin from March 1999 to May 2015 in various capacities including; Investigation Program Manager, Supervisor, and Investigator/Inspector.

**ELECTION INFORMATION:** Election dates: **August 9 and November 8**. Voting hours are 7 am to 8 pm. State law now requires a valid Photo ID before you can vote. The ID needs to have your picture and current name but does not have to have your current address. This is different than the proof of residence. When registering to vote or changing a name and/or address you will need to provide proof of residence. You can register prior to election day by stopping at Village Hall, 125 Depot Street, Monday through Friday 8 am to 4 pm until Friday before the election.
