All Services/Business should follow proper social distancing requirements

Important FYI:


- Citizens **DO NOT** need a pass/letter for driving throughout the city
- Police will not be stopping anyone for driving down the street

The list below is a summary of the broader topics that affect most of the community. This order identifies essential functions and services. The list of exceptions is long and in some cases self-explanatory. Please see the order for specific industries. For those that are identified as non-essential and therefore not allowed to operate in their traditional manner, they are permitted to meet minimum basic operations:

- The minimum necessary activities to maintain the value of the business's inventory, preserve the condition of the business's physical plant and equipment, ensure security, process payroll and employee benefits, or for related functions, including where these functions are outsourced to other entities.
- The minimum necessary activities to facilitate employees of the business being able to continue to work remotely from their residences.



Massage therapists are included in healthcare operations



Veterinary care for animals is allowed; non-essential care should be rescheduled



Organizations that provide charitable and social services can operate. See page #11, "G" of the Governor's Order



Construction projects may continue



Citizens may leave their homes for doctor visits, essential supplies (groceries, prescriptions), outdoor activities.

Outdoor activities shall not include team or contact sports (ex: basketball, soccer, football).

Parks will be open; Playgrounds will be **CLOSED**.



Childcare Facilities are still operating with the including and shall prioritize care for families as follows:

- Tier 1: employees, contractors, and other support staff working in health care;
- Tier 2: employees, contractors, and other staff in vital areas including but not limited to military; long term care; residential care; pharmacies; child care; child welfare; government operations; public safety and critical infrastructure such as sanitation, transportation, utilities, telecommunications; grocery and food services; supply chain operations; and other sectors as determined by the Secretary of the Department of Children and Families.



Restaurants and bars have no changes and can continue operating with take out and delivery (restaurants only).



Stores that sell groceries and medicine remain open. See order, page 9, item 13B for more information.



Hardware stores may continue to operate, following social distancing as much as possible



Weddings and funerals may continue if they meet the 10 people or less restriction



Laundromats and dry cleaning services may continue to operate while observing the social distancing guidelines



Mail and package delivery will continue as normal

Taxi and transportation providers may still operate. Riders should social distance as much as possible (single riders sit in back, not in front seat)
