Build a Better World

at the Johnson Creek Public Library



Registration for the Johnson Creek Public Library's annual summer library program begins Friday, June 9 and will continue through the middle of July. This year's theme is **Build a Better World**. Area children, ages three and up through those just having completed eighth grade, are invited to register for the eight-week program, which runs from June 9 through August 4. Participants receive a reading record and can earn a variety of incentives by keeping track of the reading they have completed. For every 25 hours read up to 100 hours, participants will also earn a free book.



Weekly activities at the Johnson Creek Public Library include

Children ages 3-6 will enjoy **Building Buddies** on Mondays at 1:00 p.m. beginning June 19. The children will use blocks and a variety of cardboard and plastic materials to create different structures.

Children ages 3-6, including those who have just completed kindergarten, will enjoy **Early Literacy Class** on Fridays at 10:00 a.m. beginning June 16. Formerly called Story Hour, children in attendance will listen to books; learn finger plays and songs; and do a simple craft.

Children ages 1-2 will enjoy **Toddler Story Time** Wednesdays and Thursdays at 10:30 a.m. beginning June 14 and 15. Each toddler must be accompanied by an adult. Childcare will be provided for older children if a volunteer is available.

Children who have completed first grade or older are invited to the weekly **craft sessions**, which begin Tuesday, June 20 at 2:00 p.m.

Children who have completed kindergarten or older are invited to a **LEGOs and Strawbees** activity on Thursday afternoons at 2:00 p.m. beginning June 15.

Children and adults are invited to **free movies** on Wednesdays beginning, June 14 at 2:00 p.m.

High school students and adults are invited to participate in the library's adult reading program. They will receive a reading record to keep track of the titles read. At the end of the program, participants submitting their reading folders will receive a small prize.

VILLAGE BOARD UPDATES

At the May 22, 2017, meeting the Village Board adopted the sidewalk policy/inspection form. This form will be used by the Department of Public Works to help determine the condition of sidewalks. In accordance with the Village Ordinance §210-2 The owner of the abutting land shall have the duty to repair, construct and perpetually maintain sidewalks, in a workmanlike manner, along or upon any street, alley or highway in the Village of Johnson Creek and shall pay the entire cost thereof. Whenever an owner shall neglect, for a period of 20 days after service of notice upon him according to §66.0907m, Wis. Stats., to lay, remove replace, or repair any such sidewalk, the Village Board may cause such work to be done at the expense of the owner.

The Village Board appointed Scott Thomas to the Community Development Authority and Charles Schick to the Library Board.

T&S Management LLP was granted a Conditional Use Permit to add an additional storage building to property at 1075 Remmel Drive.
